- Abstracts containing identical or nearly identical data submitted from the same institution and/or individuals may be disqualified.
- Submission of an abstract constitutes a commitment by the author(s) as to the integrity of the data and that they agree with the submission.
- If the research presented in the abstract has been funded or supported, in whole or in part, by a grant, please indicate so during the submission process.

- Abstracts should be written and submitted by physicians, researchers, trainees, healthcare
 professionals or patient partners. Research funded by industry that has been approved by a
 Research Ethics Board, and for which the principal investigator/principal author is not an
 employee of the funding company, will be accepted for review. Abstracts submitted by
 pharmaceutical companies, or device companies, with employees as principal
 investigators/principal authors WILL NOT be accepted.
- If submitting a related abstract to multiple national and/or international meetings, please ensure that you are fully aware of the submission guidelines and regulations for all meetings.
- All abstracts must be submitted in English.
